# I. Speakers:

- Black Law Students Association (BLSA)
  - o Yohana Mihreteab, President of BLSA
    - IPC funding helped grow last year's event (used for advertising, coke grant)
    - Now a national recognized chapter of BLSA
  - Luncheon will be open to all students (undergrad, grad, prof)
  - Estimated attendance from last year: ~160 people
  - Increase in funding requests due to underestimated food costs from last year
  - **Motion Passed 30Y 0N**

- Sarah will be out for next meeting (Feb 24th), Matt will run this meeting
- Inter-Professional Education
  - Curriculum and New director
    - Met with Dr. Clinchot, hiring of new IPE director underway
    - Revamping IPE entirely
    - Feedback from senate:
      - Repeat speeches given at recent pharmacy IPE event
        - Same lecture except with nurses, very little interaction with other professions
      - Pharmacy does 3 years of IPE, sometimes other professions are not required to be there whereas others are not required. Would like some flexibility and more convenient hours
      - Optometry IPEP sessions generally considered a waste of time. Many of the topics not relevant to all of the professions in the room
        - DiSC assessment not well received from optometry
      - Active learning (book club) much more preferred than a lecture for Vet
      - Dentistry felt disrespected by other professions at some IPE events
      - Down the line, healthcare professions central building being built (primarily for Medicine)

- Goal is to have a good relationship with the IPE director
- Food served at some of these events are not always presented with safe food options
- Professional Student Affordability Class
  - Steven Leborec and Tim Ulbrich teaching
  - Vet and Optometry have personal finance education integrated into classes
    - Optometry feels there might be a small amount of interest
  - Not meant to be a graded class
  - Potential interest among dentistry and pharmacy
  - Some students would like graded versus pass/fail
  - Availability all years of professional is preferred
  - Focus on paying off large amounts of debt over a short period of time, or at your own pace.
