 - Union garage parking spots are not available, but CampusParc offered 200 parking spots in Gateway garages and will offer those spots at reduced rates (\$500 total but you can exchange your C lot pass and pay the difference → +\$100)

XIII. Chief of Staff Update: TJ Beavers

- New Diversity and Inclusion chair: Hala Abdel-Jaber (Law)
- Collaboration meeting over Diversity and Inclusion
 - Intergovernmental collaboration meeting: met to define how to define diversity and inclusion and how to better integrate it into the university.
- Buckeye experience
 - CGS initiative to rectify the program that used to exist. Program's goal is to enable disabled students to have access to university experiences
- Tuition reductions
 - Vet Med and Optometry colleges propose that 2nd-4th year students who are not classified as Ohio residents will only pay a \$5 surcharge as opposed to the non-resident surcharge for first-year students. Vet Med offered the proposal to help facilitate transfers for upper-level students. Optometry offered the proposal to reduce confusions about sticker price (allows the College to produce a simplified fee table). Both proposals were projected to be at least budget-neutral if not positive.
 - Discussions with OSU Government Affairs did not raise any pressing concerns with proposals.
 - Further fiscal meetings will be held to discuss this
