- PDF Spring window now closed big thanks to everyone who helped with promotion!
 - Discussion with Teresa and Kerry about required PDF changes
 - Prospective funding, more merit-based
 - How do we distinguish between a good and bad applicant?
 - Colleges should grade their own applicants
 - How is it evaluated now?
 - More weight given to the essay
 - Make a rubric with some general criteria + school specific criteria
 - \$5,000 from each Dean (specified just for that college)
 - Other funding divided equally between the colleges → higher % towards schools with more applicants?
 - Idea to wait until the rubrics are determined before making any changes to how money is allocated - then we can know what the ACTUAL needs are
 - Demonstration of financial need?/Disclosure of if any students are receiving any other scholarships
- Kerry Discussion

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- Costs ~\$150 to cut a check (due to all of the compliance, people that have to pass through the money, verifications, etc)
 - Need to be efficient and utilize IPC resources appropriately
- \$15,000 from Office of Academic Affairs to fund PDF (not requirement to equally distribute among colleges)
 - Legitimate idea to allocate more \$ to colleges that demonstrate more need
- Possible to go back to OAA in future years and ask for more money
 - Can also go back to the Deans of each school to ask for more \$ for their respective school
- Wants to move to a prospective process
 - Adding question to application: "How would receiving this funding impact you?"

 In the current status and future changed status, you would still need back-up documentation (receipts, abstract acceptance letter, audit form, etc) just at a different time

- Attended/Pre-registered = % attended
 - Total: 135/266 = 51%
 - Public Health: 7/9 = 78%
 - Dental: 10/13 = 77%
 - Law: 5/8 = 63%
 - Vet Med: 15/25 = 60%
 - Undergrad: 21/37 = 57%
 - Optometry: 12/22 = 55%
 - Social Work: 10/18 = 56%
 - Faculty/Staff: 5/9 = 56%
 - Other Grad: 8/16 = 50%
 - Nursing: 1/2 = 50%
 - Other: 3/6 = 50%
 - Pharmacy: 22/50 = 44%
 - Medicine: 19/51 = 37%
- Did well getting the word out!
- Participant survey patterns:
 - Very positive feedback on both keynote speakers and naloxone training
 - Many suggestions for a shorter event (perhaps more half-day)
 - Participant feedback on Excel sheet
